#### **Prevention**

### **Description of necessary first aid measures**

#### **Eye contact**

#### Inhalation

: Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If it is suspected that fumes are still present, the rescuer should wear an appropriate mask or self-contained breathing apparatus. If not breathing, if breathing is irregular or if respiratory arrest occurs, provide artificial respiration or oxygen by trained personnel. ### Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Small spill

### **Appropriate engineering** controls
